
M & M (Missions and Music) Camp

"IN HIS STEPS" Shoe Bank of McAllen



- August Communion Offering -

One of my fondest memories of the beginning of school is going with my mom to shop for school supplies and a pair of new shoes! I also remember doing the same with my own children! Yet, many families cannot provide this for their children.

In August of 1993, this church began a ministry called "In His Steps" Shoe Bank of McAllen, It is now beginning its 23rd year. This program is designed to provide children in need and enrolled in the McAllen Independent School District, with a pair of properly fitting shoes appropriate for school. This program has been very successful over the years providing shoes to between 400-700 children in McAllen each school year.

The children for whom this program benefit must: (1) be from a low income/poverty level family, (2) be currently enrolled in an MISD school (any grade), and (3) have not received a pair of shoes within the last year from the "In His Steps" Shoe Bank of McAllen.

If a child is in need of a pair of shoes and meets the above criteria, a written referral is made by the school counselor or nurse. The referral is taken to a Hope Family Health Clinic in McAllen, who issues a Voucher. The Voucher is then taken to one of the two Shoe Carnivals in McAllen where it is honored for up to \$25.00 for a new pair of shoes of the child's choice. No other purchases may be made with the Voucher. Shoe Carnival then bills First UMC for the amount of the shoes purchased. FUMC pays the bill from funds available.

Over the years, we have received assistance with funding from different sources. Each year, we have received assistance from the McAllen Community Development Block Grant program. We have once again, received notification, our church has been approved for another \$8,000 grant for the 2016-17 school year. Our church raises the remainder of funds so that 100% of funds donated go to purchasing the shoes!

Because of your generosity, last school year we were able to assist over 375 children in need with a pair of new school shoes. A team from our church makes the appropriate copies and does reports to take care of this grant!

It has always been the hope of our church family that providing a child in need with a pair of properly fitting shoes for school would benefit the child, the child's family and our community by encouraging his/her continued and uninterrupted education, which may otherwise be hindered by going without.

Our September Communion Offering will go directly to purchasing a pair of shoes for a child in need, here in McAllen. We hope you join us for our Service and Communion and that you will prayerfully consider how you might help with our ministry to provide shoes for children in need.

Spiritual Intervention

FUMC has provided backpacks of food for our students who don't quite have enough to eat. These backpacks sustain the kiddos each weekend when food isn't readily available allowing them to come back to school, fed and ready to learn. We also had the privilege of bringing our older Deaf students to "sign" Christmas Carols to the children at your FUMC Day School. Our kids loved getting to share their songs with the little kids and see the smiles on their little faces. It was also amazing for the kids to see the adults that cared about them; it impressed me that the pastor was able to pray with and for our kids, loved it! FUMC is showing Christ's love to kids that might not get exposure to Him without them. For the past two years we have also been given the benefit of Serve Our School (SOS) helping to make our school beautiful, safer, and more functional. We have a garden outside that was made for us by FUMC and it has grown vegetables and huge flowers. The kids truly love being able to grow their own plants and vegetables and they get to see, first hand, the life cycle of a plant, this supports our science TEKS. We also were able to partnership with FUMC in collecting canned food for their Food Pantry. The kids loved bringing canned goods in to help stock the pantry.

We were able to collect two truckloads of cans. FUMC is helping us to teach our kids how important it is to help other people around them and to be aware of needs outside their own little worlds. I am truly grateful for all that we have been able to do together!

Harvesting the Fruit Update

The journey continues! With the desire to continue to keep everyone informed about where we are on the journey, each month we plan to provide an update on the process of our Harvesting the Fruit campaign toward building a sanctuary.

Currently our architects are reaching out to prospective general contractors to gauge their interest in our sanctuary project. Members of the building design committee will interview prospective construction companies to select a general contractor that will begin work with our architects to complete the construction drawings. When those drawings are 60% complete, the general contractor will then give a guaranteed maximum price for the project. We anticipate having the general contractor selected in the next few weeks and four to five months to get the construction drawing to the 60% completion state.

Also, we will be working on forming several sub-committees for input into specific areas of our sanctuary. We'll have small groups to work on nursery space, audio/visual, music/choir space, furniture/equipment, landscape, interior finishes/colors and others groups as needed. If you have expertise or a desire to work with one of these small groups let chair Thomas

Davidson, one of the pastors or the church office know. This will be an exciting and busy next few months! Thank you for your continued support.
