
#### SPECIAL NEEDS SUPPORT GROUP

was a success with a large ramp being built in Edinburg and modules for 4 others built at our church. On Saturday, because of the threat of storms, standing water, and soggy ground we opted to postpone our building until the following week. On Saturday, March 10th we rallied and completed 3 ramps. Because of the condition of the yard of one home the other will be built at a later date.



Cornerstone Ministry has evolved over the past 26 years into one that serves primarily physically challenged individuals and their families with wheelchair ramps. Last year, we successfully partnered with Texas Ramp Project (TRP). We are excited to announce that Cornerstone Ministry at First UMC is now an official TRP site. We will be responsible for seeing that at least 8 ramps in our area are built per year. TRP will assist us with some funding for the ramps and we will be responsible for the rest. Several Cornerstone leaders are now trained in building TRP model ramps.

Thanks to all who made Cornerstone 2017 a huge success! This ministry can only be possible through the gifts of donations and faithful servants willing to give of their time to make life a bit easier for those that are mobility challenged!

#### Pearls of Wellness Wisdom

"Whoever receives one little child like this in My name receives Me." Matthew 18:5 (NKJV)


"Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute.

Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy." Proverbs 31:8-9 (NIV)

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. We know, though, that preventing and addressing abuse needs to occur each and every day. Having worked as a Behavioral Health nurse, I am acutely aware of the devastating and destructive effects that physical, mental, emotional and sexual abuse has in a child's life. It is up to the community agencies, schools, and churches to protect and strengthen families, since they have a great influence on family life. Children thrive on attention, affection and having their needs adequately met from and by their parents. They depend on parents to nurture them, guide, instruct, and support them on a daily basis and throughout their lifespan. Children need parents to be part of their lives and aware of their friends and activities even when parents are not very welcomed around their teenage years. Your awareness, knowledge and involvement in the care of children within your family, church, and community can help prevent or stop current abuse. Reporting child abuse and neglect is mandated by law not just for professionals but any person that witnesses it occur or suspects a child is being affected by abuse and neglect. Speak up and be an advocate. You can make a report to the Department of Family and Protective Services at 1-800-252-5400 or online or to a law enforcement agency. For more information on this subject, go to www.childwelfare.gov and www.dfps.state.tx.us/

You can advocate for children and further help to nurture communities through education, speaking to neighbors, and/or becoming a volunteer at any institution, center, or agency that serves families. If you are unable to physically participate in this manner, you can carry this need in your heart and pray for children and families in the Rio Grande Valley struggling through these issues. Pray for the foster care system in Texas that is currently overwhelmed and for the Lord to bring to fruition a vision and desire for a residential treatment center to be in place for children as they wait for placement into safe homes in the Rio Grande Valley. Pray for justice for these little ones. Pray for their healing, protection and their deliverance. Blue Sunday, which is always the last Sunday in April, is a nationally recognized day of prayer when churches can take time in their services to pray for victims of child abuse; however I encourage you to lift up this prayer request to the Lord each and every day without ceasing. Finally, remember to always thank the Lord for your family, little ones and the life and love that you all share.

#### Palm/Passion Sunday Worship Services April 9 - 8:30, 9:00 and 11:00 a.m.

On Palm/Passion Sunday we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the week before his death and resurrection. It marks the beginning of Holy Week, which concludes on Easter Sunday. The Bible reveals that when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the crowds greeted him by waving palm branches and covering his path with their garments. Immediately following this great time of celebration in the ministry of Jesus, he begins his journey to the cross.

All will receive palms before the worship services this Sunday, and before the 11:00 a.m. service all children are invited to meet outside at the entrance to the Fellowship Center foyer to receive palms and then process in together. Parents and teens are welcome to join in!

## Maundy Thursday Worship Service A Living Dramatization of the Last Supper

Thursday, April 13 • 7:00 p.m. • In the Fellowship Center Holy Thursday, also called Maundy Thursday, is the day we commemorate Jesus' Last Supper and the beginning of our sacrament, the Lord's Supper. The word Maundy comes from the Latin mandatum, which means "commandment." At the Last Supper, Jesus gave the disciples a new commandment to love one another as he had loved them (John 13:34). This is the first of the three days of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus.
