## **Annual Conference Report**

As members of the FUMC McAllen delegation to the Rio Texas Conference's second annual meeting, we experienced the diversity of experience and opinion and unity of passion for missional living and social justice that characterize Methodism writ large.

Beyond standard business (voting on budget changes, filling committee positions, etc.), we enjoyed engaging teaching sessions. Former FUMC pastor and current bishop Robert Schnase presented key points from *Just Say Yes!: Unleashing People for Ministry*. Specifically, he encouraged us to avoid overly bureaucratic processes and embrace new ideas, from unconventional worship styles to risk-taking service initiatives.

Patrick Friday, director of In Mission Together of the General Board of Global Ministries, introduced us to a 50/50 mission work model, emphasizing the need to approach projects with recognition of recipient abilities, skills, and ownership of eventual outcomes.

Additional breakout workshops highlighted topics such as alleviating human suffering and developing young leaders.

Delegates from the 2016 General Conference also discussed major decisions impacting the global church. The General Conference voted to withdraw from the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice, rejected proposals to divest from businesses profiting from Israeli occupation of Palestinian lands and fossil fuel industries, opposed prejudicial Native American representations, and worked toward the development of a new hymnal. It delayed decisions on acceptance of same-sex marriage and ordaining of LGBT clergy, approving creation of a commission to further examine the issue. This decision prompted spirited discussion, the sharing of powerful testimonies, and peaceful protests.

Worship services highlighted the best of the conference, including a service of word and table, a service of remembrance, and a reconciling service. We celebrated clergy and laity accepting new calls in the service of commissioning and ordination and, as a delegation, took time to appreciate Rev. Dr. Sanderford and Rev. Perales in their continued leadership at FUMC.

## Pearls of Wellness Wisdom

### Summer Fun and Sun Safety

As we all know, summer months in Texas produce some of the hottest temperatures. It is important that as you enjoy your vacation and more time engaged in outdoor activities, you remember to protect yourself and your family.

Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States and melanoma is the most dangerous kind. According to the CDC, there are 63,000 new cases and 9,000 deaths from melanoma every year. Ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun is the main cause of skin cancer, but can also come from tanning booths and sun lamps. Skin cancer, however, can almost always be cured when discovered and treated early. People at highest risk are those with light-colored skin and freckles. Talk to you doctor if you find unusual moles or growths on your skin and any changes in their size, shape, color, or feel, a large number of moles (more than 50) and a family history of melanoma.

Some of the ways you can take action to prevent skin cancer involves: covering up with long sleeves and/or long pants, wearing a hat and sunglasses as the skin around your eyes is also susceptible to damage, staying in the shade between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. as the sun's rays are strongest during this time, and using sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher, even on cloudy days, making sure to put it on 30 minutes before actually going outside. It is also important to keep newborns out of the sun as it is recommended that sunscreen be used on babies over the age of six months. Remember that sunscreen needs to be reapplied every two hours and after you swim or sweat. For more information, visit healthfinder.gov, SkinCancer.org, and www.cdc.gov.
