

Operation Kid Pack

Our church is involved in a partnership with Escandon Elementary School of McAllen. One of the pieces of this partnership is our sponsorship of "Operation Kid Pack." During the 2016-17 School Year we have provided 40 Kid Packs weekly for 30 weeks to feed



children that are chronically hungry in our community! That is 1200 Kid Packs! PRAISE GOD!

This ministry focuses on addressing the problem of childhood hunger, right here in our own community. Operation Kid Pack is only for children who are chronically hungry. The program provides Kid Packs with food each Friday to children who might otherwise not have food over the weekend. This is a program sponsored by the Food Bank of the RGV.

The Escandon Elementary principal and counselor identify children, in need. These are children who display one or more behaviors exhibiting hunger. These behaviors may be physical appearance, school performance, home environment, and several other factors. The counselor distributes the Kid Packs on Friday to the child, to help them through the weekend.

The June Communion Offering will go to this ministry. The Children and Youth Programs of our church serve to both organize and carry out this program! Our children and youth have committed to participating in this weekly ministry for the 2017-18 School Year. The cost of this program is approximately \$7.00 per Kid Pack and 40 Packs will be assembled every other week.

This can be done ONLY through your generosity and passion to serve children in need. We hope that you will prayerfully consider your support of this important ministry and the efforts of our children and youth as they seek to serve the less fortunate children in our community!

Pearls of Wellness Wisdom

I was recently blessed with the opportunity to attend the 2017 Keeping Our Communities Healthy Conference in Houston, Texas. The focus of the conference was about the role that good nutrition plays in health, development and healing and the importance of addressing food insecurity in patients through a collaborative effort between partners in the community such as doctors/clinics, the food bank, and other community agencies that address this issue and further provide resources. The US is plaqued by high rates of food insecurity and obesity. The problem is that low-income families that struggle to make ends meet would rather buy more filling, calorie-dense foods than costly nutrient-rich foods and also tend to engage in cycles of food deprivation and overeating. This is then coupled with high levels of stress. As a result food insecurity brings about serious mental and physical health consequences such as depression, heart disease, diabetes and cancer which further drive up health care costs. I, however, strongly believe that change, though slow and gradual, is possible. The good news is that this awareness and education is spreading and being brought to our communities here in the Rio Grande Valley. Through coalitions and other collaborative efforts, we are also working to increase people's access to fresh fruits and vegetables as well as increase access to physical activity opportunities to create healthier communities.

I want to express my deep gratitude for all the Manna Food Pantry volunteers and our Health Ministry Chair, Tanya Perales for their support of the resources fair held on May 15th for the clients we serve there. Our clients were able to obtain necessary information from agencies in the community regarding the resources and benefits they can receive to obtain holistic health. I am grateful for this church and its various ministries and the resources, assistance, and support it provides to the community. Have a very blessed and safe summer!


