May's Communion Offering will go to the feeding ministries of First UMC. Providing physical and spiritual needs is what these ministries seek to do! Many come to our church for supplemental food, a meal, or to hear the Word. We seek to provide, not only these things, but to show our faith by our actions!

- An average of 50 families are given supplemental food from Food Pantry on the third Monday of every month.
- Emily's Meals prepares and delivers lunch to 40 homeless people three days a month. This ministry is a partnership with others in our community. Also, once or twice a year, we host a picnic for our homeless friends.
- Emergency food is given to those in need who come to the Church office.
- During Teacher Appreciation Month we show our faith by providing breakfast to the teachers and staff at a partner school, Escandon Elementary.
- Our church family also has a special feeding ministry sometime during the year.

## Pearls of Wellness Wisdom

#### *"Whoever receives one little child like this in My name receives Me." Matthew 18:5 (NKJV)*

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month. We know, though, that preventing and addressing abuse needs to occur every day. The Department of Family and Protective Services received 12,697 reports of abuse and neglect in Hidalgo and Starr Counties in 2017 alone. Nationwide, more than 3 million confirmed cases of child abuse occur annually. Having worked as a Behavioral Health nurse, I am acutely aware of the devastating and destructive effects that physical, mental, emotional and sexual abuse have in a child's life. The community's agencies, schools, and churches must protect and strengthen families. Children thrive on attention, affection, and having their needs adequately met from and by their parents. They depend on parents to nurture them, guide, instruct, and support them daily and throughout their lifespan. Children need parents to be part of their lives and aware of their friends and activities even when parents are not very welcomed around their teenage years. Your awareness, knowledge, and involvement in the care of children within your family, church, and community can help prevent or stop abuse. Reporting child abuse and neglect is mandated by law, not just for professionals but for any person who witnesses it or suspects a child is being abused or neglected. Speak up and be an advocate. You can make a report to the Department of Family and Protective Services at 1-800-252-5400, or online, or to a law enforcement agency.

You can advocate for children and further help to nurture communities through education, speaking to neighbors, and/or becoming a volunteer at any institution, center, or agency that serves families. If you are unable to physically participate, you can carry this need in your heart and pray for children and families in the Rio Grande Valley struggling through these issues. Pray for the foster care system in Texas that is currently overwhelmed and for more resources to become available. Pray that abused children will be rescued. Pray for their rescuers and for justice for these little ones. Pray for their healing, protection, and deliverance. Pray they are placed with caring people. Blue Sunday, always the last Sunday in April, is a nationally recognized day of prayer when churches can take time in their services to pray for victims of child abuse; however, I encourage you to lift up this prayer request to the Lord each and every day without ceasing. Finally, remember to always thank the Lord for your family, for little ones, and for the life and love that you all share.
